If you're organising a walk, please ensure you take responsibility for planning and safety, including:

- Choosing a safe and accessible route
- Completing a risk assessment
- Arranging supervision and first aid
- Nominating marshals for safety and communication
- Monitoring weather and having a backup plan
- Coordinating with schools or other groups

For individuals or small groups please ensure you take responsibility for your and consider:

- Planning a safe route and check the weather
- Carrying a phone and let someone know your plans
- Respecting others and stay on public paths
- Bringing a small first aid kit and know where the nearest defibrillator is:
